MY THOUGHTS, YOUR SUCCESS: NAVIGATING EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE 3Ls: AUGUST: A TIME TO REFLECT ON TRUE PATRIOTIC SPIRIT!!!



General Cariappa took over as Commander-in-Chief of the Indian army from Francis Butcher the last commander-in-chief of India on 15th January. This day is observed as the Army Day. Army day also honours the soldiers who have sacrificed their lives for the country.

K.M.Cariappa popularly known as Kipper led the Indian forces on the western front during 1947. He is one of the two army officers to hold the 5-star rank of Field Marshal. He retired in 1953 whereafter he served as High Commissioner to Australia and New Zealand till 1956.

During the 1956 war, the plane of his son was shot down and he was captured and held as a prisoner of war. [POW]. General Ayub Khan, who was the President of Pakistan during the 1965 war, had served under K. M. Cariappa in the British Indian Army before 1947. Out of respect for his former superior officer, he contacted the retired Cariappa to offer his son's release.

Cariappa replied which became legendary, "He is no longer my son. He is the son of the country. A soldier fighting for the country is a true patriot. Many thanks for your kind gesture. But I request you to release all or none. Give him no special treatment".

K. C. Cariappa, the son remained a POW until the end of the war, when he was repatriated along with other Indian prisoners. He continued to serve in the Indian Air Force and eventually retired with the rank of Air Marshal.

Such is the patriotic fervour of our army. It's no wonder when it is said, "Our flag does not fly because the wind moves it; It flies with the last breath of every soldier who died protecting it".
