★ NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY: Honouring Ramanujan's legacy through Creative and Experiential Learning!

★ PRIMARY: Grades 1 to 5

A variety of activities to highlight the work and impact of the Indian mathematician Srinivasa Ramanujan was planned for students

Grade 1 focused on converting multiplication facts into repeated addition.

Grade 2 engaged in 'Spend Money with Math', where they used specimen money to buy books, calculate bills, and determine change.

Grade 3 played basketball in teams, converting their scores into fractions and comparing them to identify the winning team.

Grade 4 participated in a 'Treasure Hunt with Integers', solving integer-based clues to earn points for their group. Grade 5 explored the idea that 'Math is an expression of the human mind', by creating geometric figures.



★ TEACHER ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

PRE PRIMARY AND PRIMARY: Practical tips for faster and more efficient notebook corrections

Ms. Priya Natraj, our Early Years and Primary Coordinator conducted the session that focussed on efficient notebook correction strategies. She shared practical techniques to streamline the correction process, ensuring students not only complete their work on time but also submit their notebooks for timely review. Strategies such as developing better copying habits, incorporating peer reviews, setting clear submission deadlines, promoting self-correction and making on-the-spot corrections, instituting dedicated notebook-checking days and organizing notebooks in batches were imparted. These valuable insights equipped teachers with effective tools to enhance the efficiency of the correction process while maintaining quality feedback.





★ LOWER SECONDARY,IGCSE AND A LEVELS: Enhancing Communication Skills Among Students

Dr. Amee Vora, Principal of DGCMS, conducted an enriching session towards empowering teachers to cultivate communication skills as a foundation for lifelong learning and success among students. Key insights from the session included:

- Building Listening Skills: Encourage students to first listen attentively (audio) before acting or speaking, in both monitored and unmonitored settings.
- 2. **Making Learning Relatable:** Present information that resonates with students' everyday lives for better engagement.
- 3. **Empathetic Listening:** Build empathy to recognize the personal challenges many may face.
- 4. **Incorporating Mythology:** Utilize elements like symbols, stories, and philosophies (e.g., Chanakyaniti) to make lessons more impactful and culturally rich.
- 5. Storytelling by Real-Life Heroes: Introduce narratives of real-life achievers to inspire and motivate students.
- 6. Adaptability in Approach: Strategies to suit the classroom dynamics were discussed.
- Developing Research Skills: Guide students in exploring and analyzing information independently to enhance critical thinking.
- 8. **Parental Involvement:** Organize sessions with parents to align efforts at home and school for better communication development.
- Mother Tongue Affiliation: Emphasize the importance of connecting with one's linguistic roots to build a strong cultural identity.
- Strengthening Emotional Quotient: Focus on nurturing emotional intelligence to create empathetic and self-aware individuals.
