Food chain was learned with the help of a game.




Grade 3

French - Students had a joyful time learning about the beautiful seasons in France.

Science: Students researched the types of animals based on their eating habits. A few more examples

were added by the teacher. The students then asked each other if their example belongs to the herbivore, carnivore or omnivore groups. And placed the same in the Venn diagram.









Grade 4

Science: Students of grade 4 learnt the stages in seed germination by getting different seeds to school and placing them on the windowsill with just the right amount of water everyday for a week. Some seeds were kept in the shade, some were left unwatered. Their conclusions were:

They learnt how not all seeds germinate at the same rate, some seeds need less water, all seeds need sunlight and water to germinate.

They observed the seedlings and noted down the same after a class discussion.

Students observed and identified parts of a flower and noted it down.

French: Activity on French monuments and cardinal and ordinal numbers.



Grade 5

French: Students made their very own calendar which consisted of all the important French and Indian dates of the year.

Science: Students learnt the types of rocks and the stages of the rock cycle with the help of chocolates. The learnt each step by doing, observing and discussing. They noted down how at the end of it all they started with one type of chocolate but in the end had different forms of it, in terms of appearance and the way it was formed. The class end with the rock cycle song and relishing the chocolates among themselves and the named it "Rock chocolates"

Water retention in different types of soil was learnt through an experiment in class. They got their hands dirty to check the characteristics of soil they had learnt about.




